# ORDER OF THE ARROW

By James Burt, Scoutmaster The Order of the Arrow (OA), is Scouting's National Honor Society. It is an organization within the Boy Scouts of America almost as old as Scouting itself. Started in 1915 as a summer camp program, it has grown to be a national organization with almost every council across the United States having an OA lodge.

Members are chosen by their fellow scouts in an annual Order of the Arrow unit election. Youth are elected by secret ballot by the youth of the unit after approval of the leader. To be eligible for OA, a scout must be a registerd member of the Boy Scouts of America, hold the rank of First Class (as a minimum), and have at least 15 days and nights of Boy Scout camping during the two-year period immediately prior to the elect. The 15 days and nights must include one, but no more than one, long-term camp consisteng of six consecutive days and five nights of resident camping, approved and under the auspices and standards of the Boy Scouts of America.

The balance of the camping must be overnight, weekend, or other short-term camps. This year, Troop 228 will hold OA Elections on November 12, 2002. An OA team from the Keystone District will be at the troop meetig to run the election. Each scout may vote for any or all of those nominated by the Scoutmaster that they believe to be worthy. When you select a candidate, select those who, in your opinion, have set the best examples of brotherhood, cheerfulness, and service. Select only those you believe will continue in unselfish service to the troop. When the voting is finished, the District OA team counts the number of ballots turned in and enters that number on the election report. Every ballot will be counted. All or any number of the eligible candidates can be elected. There is no limit. Once the ballots have been counted and turned in the scouts elected to the OA will be "tapped out" at a district funtion such as Freeze-o-ree or Camporee. Make sure you attend this special night!!
